...highlighting the massively disproportionate number of minority members working in the sewers or as lavatory cleaners, and sweepers. It was further pointed out that nearly half of the posts reserved for religious minorities in government jobs remain vacant and even with the posts that are filled, 80 per cent of non-Muslims are employed to carry out jobs for which they are paid less.
