All-Party Parliamentary Group for the Pakistani Minorities

The Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office will host the international Ministerial Conference to promote freedom of religion or belief this summer (5 -6 July) in London

The 2022 Ministerial is a forum for world leaders, ministers and policymakers of governments around the world, that will be hosted by the UK in July 2022. Leading up to the Ministerial, organisations in the FoRB sector will run 100 FoRB focussed events across the UK, as part of FoRB Fringe. These fringe events and the Ministerial Conference will have a special focus on protecting at-risk religious or belief communities.

The APPG is planning to hold two side events at the QE Conference Hall.

1. Forced Conversions and Forced Marriages of Young Minority Girls in Pakistan

2. Discrimination and Challenges Faced by the Minorities Students and Teachers in the education system in Pakistan

The events in QE Conference hall will not be open to general public but it will provide the APPG with a golden opportunity to lobby and influence the policy makers, from around the world.
